Dear Friends,

This is another special monthly e-mail prayer and praise report (E-PPR) about Czech and Slovak ministry just for you. We ASKED - YOU PRAYED - HE ANSWERED:

THANK YOU FOR kind words and reaction to our E-PPR. We love to be personal as possible and this is hopefully one way. This month has been quite busy and so our June report is a little bit late.

Last weekend Klara had a reunion with classmates from grade school to celebrate their 60th birthdays. Klara was born on the Czech German border, which used to be populated mostly by Germans. After the war Germans were expelled and then Czechs who were displaced by the war moved in. Towns along the border were cut right in the middle. For the next 40 years this was a territory with border patrols and a military presence and often the road was next to German territory. In old days non-residents could not even enter this territory. Plowed strips of land, guard towers and barbed wires are no longer there but it is still a wounded part of the world. However, the hunting is still great, since the wildlife was undisturbed for such long time. Now it is possible to cross to Germany just by walking. Since the fall of Iron Curtain (in 1989) lot of East Germans moved to the west side. On the Czech side there is growing unemployment.

The sad part is that not one of Klara's schoolmates or teachers are believers as God is as real to them as Santa Claus. The Lord gave us an opportunity to share the Gospel with one of the ladies - last year she had a stroke. It is so hard to "undo" godlessness from hearts of humanly speaking "nice" people. We rejoice with a recent family visit where we could talk to three "fifty and over children" from Klara's childhood. They had many questions and interactions in three-generation setting, which was really challenging. Once again we see how crucial is for us to be here and to go where the souls are.

PRAISES:

In our regular letters we shared with you how we marvel that the Lord keeps us active and motivated to serve in Czech and Slovak Republics. In the past we asked that you pray that the HCJB World Radio ministry in Czech Republic and Slovakia could expand. The Lord is answering these prayer in unexpected ways.

HCJB Euro conference was an encouragement to us and our HCJB Slovak team. During the Slovak presentation they shared, "We are getting many letters, some of them are very short just expressing appreciation and thankfulness. Some letters are longer, sharing with us life stories, testimonies about how a person has found new strength in relationship with God. All the letters give us the reason to go ahead in spite of the difficulties we are facing. These letters are like oxygen for our lungs." The Slovak work is done by a small team of volunteers. We have no budget to speak of but the Lord provides. Please pray for dedicated servants, protection and encouragement for all of us.
