IN HIS TIME

The health condition of our pastor Daniel is a great example of the Lord's timing. Daniel's paraproteins (markers) showed some changes in January and within three months reached critical condition. In our last prayer letter we mentioned an experimental program of new treatment his doctor recommends. There are about 600 patients in this study and Daniel was chosen to be part of life-long treatment in a control group. Cost of this treatment is very high. Providentially it is covered by a Eurounion grant. If his condition would have changed a few days earlier or later, he would have missed being part of this study. Currently, he started new medications. He has a hard road to travel.

VISITORS

It was our pleasure to host Ken and Irene Edgar, who we met in Quito more than 20 years ago. Their visit was the inspiration to take a trip to a recently restored castle with very interesting history. It dates back to the 12th century. It is known as a castle of three "emperors." One of the owners was a "railroad king." He built railroads in Germany, Romania, France and Austria. In 1869 he bought three potential adjacent demesnes. He had great plans. He planned to mine coal and build iron-

works, steelworks and iron mills. In a short time the castle was refurbished and expanded. About 15,000 workers and artisans were employed. In 1875, in the midst of the greatest expansion, his endeavor was killed by his great indebtedness that led to bankruptcy. Man can have big plans but the Lord is always in charge. That's nothing new under the sun. What is interesting is that he was a German Jew who converted to Christianity.

During WWII the castle became headquarters of the SS. The Germans tested their first radar there. The next owner, during communist era, was the government of Czechoslovakia. It became the top secret place where the Russians housed their surveillance headquarters. During the Bush's presidency, the United States was interested in placing anti-missile radar nearby. However, with the new U.S. administration the plans were abandoned. The bedrock of the area is comprised of jasper rock that reflects radar waves about 2-3 times better than typical bedrocks.

After 1989 the castle ownership was transferred to the nearby town of Zbiroh. The town was not financially strong enough to refurbish and maintain the property. Since 2004 the castle has been under the private ownership of one person. Now the castle and the adjacent area is open to the public. It is a popular place for weddings, team leadership trainings and conferences. It functions as a hotel with 50 rooms.

The castle tour is focused on Masonic history. Quite a few Czech presidents, artists, influential people and well know personalities were members of the Lodge. One of the large reception rooms is a Masonic lodge meeting place. The tour guide jokingly said that before anything is agreed upon at the Hradcany Castle (seat of Czech President) everything is decided here.

Our next outing with a couple visiting us in May will be Terezin, the concentration camp.

On April 17th we celebrated our 47th anniversary. Klara got 47 long stem roses and learned a few tricks to keep them alive. Three more years and we will celebrate our golden wedding anniversary...
