NOVEMBER 8, 2015 THE FIRST DAY FOR "BIBLE CHURCH PRAHA"

This date is marked by several significant historical events. This is the day celebrated in some Protestant countries as a Day of Reformation. Until the 20th century it was accepted as fact that on October 31, 1517, Luther posted the Ninety-five Theses, which he had composed in Latin, on the door of the Castle Church of Wittenberg, according to university custom. Today, this day is known as the International Day of the Persecuted Church. However, for the Czechs, November 8, 1620 is the most significant—when Protestants were defeated by Catholics just about two miles from our home. NEW HOLIDAY

The Good Friday was reinstated as a State holiday. Communists abolished it 65 years ago. Do you know why? CURRENT MIGRATION SITUATION

There is hardly a day when we do not hear and see how the migrant crises affect the European Union. The civil war in Syria has stretched on for five years; at present time there are almost two million Syrian refugees living in Turkey. Among them are no Christians. For a while we could think that this is a humanitarian crisis. People-smuggling in Turkey is a well-organized business. Daily thousands of migrants pay their way to get on the rubber boat to European shore. The recent pro-Islamic outcome of the Turkish presidential election is something to be concerned about as well. Islamists have now the trump cards in their hands. Millions of Turks are living in Germany and two more million Islamists are ready to invade the European social system. The recent flood of migrants is rather nothing short of invasion of young male Muslims. This is one method to conquer the whole continent without tanks, planes and military power. Local defenses consist of a few soldiers, police and firemen. Those who are already living in Europe are boasting that they will conquer Europe with the wombs of their women. With their fertility rate and no children in the West it will take one generation.

The politically correct humanistic multicultural religion of the Euro Union (especially Germany) opened the gates to all Syrians. The results of the German "Wel-

comeculture" are that by the end of this year they will have 1.5 million migrants in their country. Generous social programs and respect to their religious practices are an irresistible temptation to seize the opportunity. Not all of the migrants are people endangered by the war in the areas where everyone is in the battle with everyone else. It is only matter of time until European culture and democracy will turn into "dhimmicracy". People of the Koran will establish totalitarian rules similar to those which came to Iran after one regime was replaced by Ayatolah Khomeni. According Sharia law, all non-Muslims are obliged to pay "dhimmi tax", called "dzizia." It appears as if the Euro Union is ready to commit collective suicide.

The German newspaper Die Welt (The World) quoted the German secret service analysis declaring the integration of hundred thousands of illegal immigrants is impossible due to their number and already existing parallel society. The document is critical to the fact that Germany is importing Islamic extremism, Arabic anti-Semitism, ethnic conflicts and different views on law and order in society. Authorities will not be able to guarantee safety and enforce the law.

This means that lack of will to handle critical situation creates chaos at the borders and violence at the camps. So far the Euro Union does not guard its borders and has no real plan to handle the whole situation except to distribute immigrants by quotas to Euro Union members. Belgium, Sweden, Holland, France, and Britain are willing to take some in. Those who are not willing to open their gates will be forced to comply. The resettlement agencies in America and Canada are willing to accept some of them in spite of the fact that the majority of refugees from the Middle East are perpetually on food stamps.

Most of the migrants come from Afghanistan, Iraq, Bangladesh, Pakistan and other Islamic countries as well as Balkan countries (Kosovo, Serbia, Albania, Bosnia, Macedonia), numerous African countries (Algeria, Eritrea, Nigeria, Somalia, Mali, Congo, Senegal ...). They are jumping on the band wagon of this crisis. The countries which are in their path are overwhelmed by their numbers. Once they are in the Euro Union, even if they do not get asylum, no one will get them out. It is not hard to imagine what is ahead of us. One scenario may be the same violence as in the Middle East. The ethnic civil war in Yugoslavia was just a prelude to what may eventually flare in Europe. Austria, Slovenia and Bavaria are the next countries whispering that they might build some kind of fence to have some control over who is coming. Politically correct violent behaviors of migrants are called dynamic. The future of Europe is bleak. The next step beyond the post-Christian era is a post-Western era leading to post-tolerance clashes amongst civilization.

With new Russian involvement in Syria more refugees are on the move. Small countries on the outskirts of Schengen, like Hungary, are building fences. The flow will not stop until the Euro Union starts guarding their outer borders. The humanistic cult of open society without borders has already backfired. Out of those three families in Czech Republic one has already disappeared incognito to Germany with a sick child.
