

MARCH 2018 DEAR FRIENDS AND PARTNERS OF THE REACH BEYOND MINISTRY TO THE PEOPLES IN CZECHIA AND SLOVAKIA

Right after our conference, the country was under flu epidemic. February was the worst time. As we were recovering from fever flu malady hard winter hit. Freezing temperatures, snow in March and strong winds caused damage. Instead of spring signs, it looks like winter has just arrived.

At this time, our son Vit arrived for ten days from Denver to Germany for training. It was a very intensive training; and he was glad to leave Germany and come to Prague to see us. Together we had a great family time. Prague is always full of interesting events and we took advantage of the proximity. We squeezed in a day trip to several UNESCO World Heritage Sites in Kutná Hora (Kuttenberg) about 60 miles east of Prague.

KUTNÁ HORA

The town Kutná Hora began in 1142, by 1260 German miners began to mine silver. From the 13th to 16th century, the city competed with Prague economically, culturally and politically. It became the favorite residence of several Bohemian kings.

The Cathedral of St Barbara, a jewel of the Late Gothic period and one of the four cathedral-type buildings in Bohemia, was inscribed on the UNESCO World Heritage List together with the Cathedral of the Assumption of Our Lady and St John the Baptist and the historical center of Kutná Hora. The splendor of this structure is tangible testament to the fame and riches of the silver Kutná Hora as well as of the deep devotion of its creators. The cathedral is dedicated to Virgin Barbara, an early Christian martyr, invoked as a helper in need, an intercessor for a good death, and a patron of all who carry on a dangerous occupation, especially miners. And it was in fact miners who contributed the most to the medieval town's blossoming as well as to the construction of the cathedral, which they dedicated to their holy protectress.

Construction of St. Barbara's Cathedral started in 1388 and in 1588 for lack of finances ceased. Following Hussite invasion in the 15th century the cathedral was left in ruins. In 1626, part of the church property was handed over to Jesuit College dormitory. Last part of construction was finished in 1905.



The cathedral's present-day appearance dates back to the 19th and 20th centuries, when the church underwent an extensive regothisation and a total restoration. The exterior and interior of cathedral is magnificent.

THE SEDLEC OSSUARY

In the mid-14th century, during Black Death, and after the Hussite wars in the 15th century, many thousands were buried in the abbey cemetery. Around 1400, a Gothic church was built in the center of the cemetery with a vaulted upper level and lower chapel to be used as ossuary. After 1511, the task of exhuming skeletons and stacking the bones was given to a half-blind monk. In 1870, František Rint, a woodcarver, was employed by the Schwarzenberg family to put together the bone heaps into order, yielding a macabre result.

The ossuary is estimated to contain the skeletons of between 40,000 and 70,000 people, whose bones have, in many cases, been artistically arranged to form decorations and furnishings for the chapel. An enormous chandelier of bones, which contains at least one of every bone in the human body, hangs from the center of the nave with garlands of skulls draping the vault.
