BACK TO SCHOOL TIME AND HISTORY LESSON

Almost forgotten but making a difference in our days

Every year America celebrates Labor Day, remembers 9/11 and the loss of some 2,800 lives. The men charged with this crime will be judged on January 11, 2021, at a military court in Guantánamo, nearly 20 years after the devastating attack.

On September 1, 1939, 80 years ago Germany invaded Poland. On August 23, 1939, Nazi Germany and the Soviet Union signed a Pact of peace. In a secret protocol of "spheres of influence" was an agreement of possible rearrangement of territories belonging to Poland, Lithuania, Latvia, Estonia, and Finland. On September 17, just 16 days after Germany, the Soviet Union also invaded Poland. The territory of Poland was divided between Germany and the Soviet Union. More than one million Poles, those regarded as a threat to the Communist order, were deported to labor camps in the Soviet Union. Small neighboring countries were annexed by the Soviet Union. In 1940, the Nazi Germany war machine conquered much of Western Europe, including France. The pact of peace was terminated on 22 June 1941 while Nazi Germany invaded the Soviet Union.

America officially entered the war after the Japanese attacked Pearl Harbor on December 7, 1941, and had to fight on two fronts: Europe and the Pacific. Those events are history but political consequences are still alive in Europe.

The Revolutions of 1989 was the beginning of the Soviet Union's collapse and the end of its domination of Central and Eastern Europe. After the fall of communism, the European political outcome changed drastically. Countries betrayed, occupied and dominated by the Soviet Union joined NATO. Some of them became members of the

European Union. Poland now became the most reliable NATO partner. After 40 years of communist oppression and officially proclaimed atheism, nations were free and Christians became free to worship.

CZECH MINISTRY

I planted, Apollos watered, but God was causing the growth. So then neither the one who plants nor the one who waters is anything, but God who causes the growth. (1 Cor 3:6-7)

That is the story of our life. One of our listeners, while we were broadcasting years back, spent time editing program texts from those days. He completed it in an e-book format. What a surprise to us, what an encouragement. His word speaks no matter if it was spoken now or in the past. Planted seed sprouts when the time is right. We know that it never returns void:

...to the one an aroma from death to death, to the other an aroma from life to life. And who is adequate for these things? (2 Cor 2:16).

The same goes for Martin Luther's book "The Bondage of the Will" published in the Czech language almost 500 years after it was first published (1525). The eternal word is alive.

Radio Logos Slovakia

We will meet Milan Hudec to get more personal information regarding ongoing ministry in Slovakia this month. The Quarterly Radio expense report relating to broadcasting breaks down as follows: The monthly budget to be on the air is about \$2,100. Out of this sum, the monthly Music copyright fee is \$100.35, internet-streaming fee is \$35, plus studio cost, supplies and of course, taxes and fees. All these needs are a matter of prayer.

As of now, this month TWR is starting to broadcast 24/7 on the internet. This July TWR was assigned a satellite license.

Here and there, we get the message that our mailing could not be delivered or additional action is required.
