FALL IS HERE

As we are entering the last quarter of this year we are enjoying sunny and colorful days. The turn of the season is creeping in. Pumpkins are the first reminder that Christmas is practically around the corner.

Since our last letter we experienced an unwelcomed excitement. Our September Electronic Newsletter, though written on time, has been delayed due to the hacking of our Gmail in mid-September. After a slightly complicated repossession of our Gmail account, we were able to retrieve all our addresses. However, all mail was gone.

We apologize for any inconvenience the hacker caused to you. We appreciate your concern for our safety.

Whenever you receive a suspicious email, find out whether your email browser has the capability to report phishing. Usually the menu referring to the email that lists Reply, Forward, Delete etc., will often contain "Report Phishing."

Common sense advice: it is safer to be a few days or weeks without internet access than to assume that signing into Internet Hotspots at public places is safe. We added some additional safety measures however nothing is 100% hacker or phishing proof.

OUR CHURCH

We resumed another season of our regular Bible study. Our new pastor is temporarily preaching twice a month. He will move in and begin his full time pastorate ministry on January 1, 2014. We like his preaching/teaching, however we are not sure that the congregation will become accustomed to and appreciate his theological depth.

Recently we got hands on a small brochure which was published on the 100th anniversary of the founding of the Brethren Church. The church we have been attending is the plant of this first one. Next year (2014) this denomination will celebrate its 120th anniversary.

On November 1, 1872 three missionaries sent by the Boston Mission Board arrived and planted six Reformed churches in Prague. Among those who came were Edwin A. Adams, and Dr. A.W. Clark. Adams served in Prague for ten years. The Free Reformed Church was established in June 1880. Church members ministered mostly among needy people and started home services. As the number of attending people grew, neighbors, police and local authorities started to pay attention to what was going on. They experienced some hostility

and persecution. Later on they rented a large apartment with windows toward the back tract (in order to not attract attention from the street). Soon they had three Sunday services. Now we understand why a number of protestant churches today still have their buildings hidden in the back tract of the properties.

From 1894 till 1917 the Church already had two full time pastors / preachers. After 1918, the Czech Reformed and Lutheran Church joined together and renamed the denomination the Unity of Czech Brethren. After World War II, the Unity of Czech Brethren was joined by congregations in Silesia (Northern Moravia) and Slovakia whose members spoke Polish and Slovak. The name was therefore changed once again, omitting the word "Czech," to The Brethren Church.

Our former pastor Daniel Heczko, who is ethnically Polish, became pastor of this church in 1987 and in 1989 started the church plant we are presently attending. Daniel's ministry ended after 18 years. For several years he battles serious health issues. After repeated chemo and the 2^{nd} bone marrow transplant he was retired. At the present time he is doing quite well and devotes his time to writing. While in the pastoral role, he became our great personal friend and mentor.

Almost every weekend we have ministry related activity. We attend different conferences and visit unsaved friends.

BROADCASTING IN SLOVAKIA

Milan Hudec and his wife recently visited us in Prague. It was a joy to interact personally. Milan is now retired and devotes all his time to Radio Logos.
