SEPTEMBER 2017 DEAR FRIENDS AND PARTNERS OF THE REACH BEYOND MINISTRY TO THE PEOPLES IN CZECHIA AND SLOVAKIA

We are shifting from the summer season and activities back into our regular schedule.

We have been following the violent weather including wild fires in California and Canada, and the hurricanes hitting Texas and Florida. Forces of nature have destroyed God's creation, people's homes and businesses, and



people's lives. Over the years, we have personally visited many of these places and we have friends in these areas. We too are praying for their safety and needs.

LOSS OF IDENTITY

We have also heard news about Americans clashing over statues and symbols of history. We have similar trends in the European Union. Bureaucrats are pushing political correctness and secularization to the point of cultural non-identity.

A German supermarket chain operating in 27 EU countries used pictures of typical Greek Orthodox Churches in its promotional materials. However, the supermarket chain altered the photos by erasing the crosses from the top of the churches' cupolas. This action caused great upheaval in Czechia in spite of the fact that most people are atheist.

The Archbishop of Prague called supermarket's decision "an unprecedented and immoral act."

"Today we are seeing a falsification of photos, tomorrow we could see the real crosses removed." Cardinal Duka wrote in a letter, which he said was a show of support for Greece and a manifestation of resistance to the falsification of history and an attack on the cultural heritage of the whole of humankind. "Our European civilization has a number of roots, and Greek democracy and philosophy are some of the most important ones."

No doubt, that religious tradition play a major role in our largely atheistic country. It seems that even atheistic Czechs will never allow replacing baby Jesus by Santa or turn Christmas into neutered holiday season.

Saint Wenceslas played major role in Christianization of this area before his brother Boleslav assassinated him in 935. Cyril and Methodius, two Byzantine Christian Theologians and Missionaries, known as "Apostles to Slavs", came in the 9th century (862) to evangelize Slavic subjects and expand Byzantine influence. Since they were fluent among other languages in Arabic, Hebrew and Latin, they translated New the Testament, Psalms and fragments from Old Testament. They devised the Glagolitic alphabet to use it in Slavonic manuscripts. They wrote the first Slavic Civil Code for Great Moravia. Until now, the Cyril and Methodius are commemorated on July 5, that day is a national holidays. (Pavel's father was born on July 5, thus his middle name was Methodius.)

Churches and cathedrals are the main attraction and the reason why so

many tourists come to Prague. No one can imagine walking over Charles Bridge with no statues of saints and patrons. As one drives through the countryside, at many intersections there are crosses with the crucified Jesus Christ. Statues of saints or patrons are on stone bridges and at small chapels along the roads. All this survived two wars, two occupations and communist era. So far, no one is trying to dismantle or tear them off.

For Czechs it is OK to add or promote pagan traditions like Halloween or Gay parades, but they do not want people to take away their heritage.

As we look at the world around us, we see a crisis of Democracy. There seems to be little left of civil democratic discussion, negotiation, and truly free speech. Our society needs to ask important questions like "What will be left if we forget our heritage and our identity?"

The first part of September was full of surprises from the past. Scott is the son from dear friends who stood with us as we came to America in 1970. When we moved from Idaho, he was 17 years old. We kept in touch with his parents while they lived and his sister, the babysitter of our boys. We met her a couple of years ago. Now, Scott recently finished 950 km walk in 30 days the Route of St. James or El Camino de Santiago in Spain. While in Europe, he contacted us. We were excited to meet him. Together we spent wonderful four days. He graduated from a mining college, and as his father and Pavel, he became geologist. On top of it, our Czech Canadian friend stopped over and you should listen to their stories and some projects they both worked on just at different times.
